1. New UCV's

Brown Printings

UCV C515

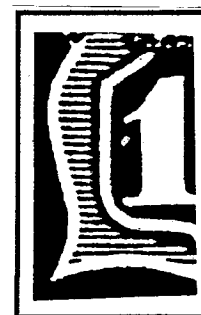
I have located 5 copies of a flaw in single crown watermark.

Dated copies are 23 Sep 19, 25 Oct 20 and ?? Jun 21.

Interesting that the spread of dates is so large.

Description is as follows:

LVT: Small white flaw about 0.5mm directly below the left end of the upper left serif of the large numeral 1.

UCV H644

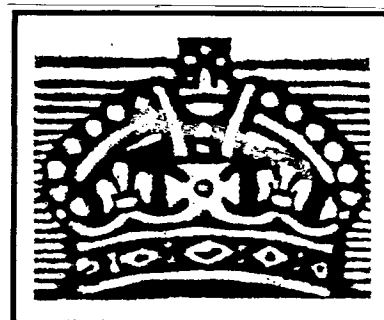
I recently found 2 copies of a stamp which are confirmed to be exactly the same.

Though neither have a full date they are both dated May.

Description is as follows:

Crown: A white smudge passes through the top half of the crown, from just above the right fleur-de-lis to the 1st pearl on the left side of the crown.

Flaw has the appearance that a paint brush has been dragged across the stamp.

2. Plated UCV's

UCV H199 Plated as 18R32

In my Article dated January 2016, H151 was plated as 18R26.

Don Landers recently advised that UCV H199 was listed as being located below UCV H151.

H199 is therefore plated as 18R32.

A description is as follows:

AUSTRALIA: Variable blurred flaw between and above upper Portions of "U" and "S" of AUSTRALIA.
