THREE HALFPENCE DIE I BROWN PRINTINGS
NEW DISCOVERIES, PLATINGS & DESCRIPTIONS**

UCV's C71 Plated as 8L37 and C72 Plated as 8L38

Michael Eastick has advised that whilst searching through his stock Graeme Plaw located a vertical pair of KGV 11/2d brown single watermark stamps, the bottom one of which he was able to plate as 8L43, and thought that the top one may be UCV C192.

Examination of the scan provided showed that the top stamp is in fact UCV C71, which has a similar flaw to UCV C192.

UCV C71 had previously been identified as coming from the left column of a sheet.

In addition to this, previous research had identified that UCV C72 was located adjacent to and to the right of UCV C71.

This means that UCV C71 is plated as 8L37 and UCV C72 is plated as 8L38.

Descriptions for 8L37/38 are as follows:

8L37 (Was UCV C71)

Bottom Frame: Small shallow notch
6mm from right corner.

Note: This flaw is similar to and should not be confused with UCV C192, which is slightly different in shape and further to the left.

8L38 (Was UCV C72)

Right Frame: Badly damaged and rough
For 9mm commencing 5mm below upper
Corner.
