Have-a-Go Newspaper article on the 'many' wifes of Stanley Gibbons. by Mike Smits

The History and Future of Stamp Collecting: Part 7

Many a time I've been told by the wife of a stamp collector how she sees herself as a stamp widow because he spends too much of his spare time absorbed in his collection. "At least you're still alive" is what I might say in return which momentarily distracts his attention away from my stamps while the wife looks at me either puzzled or aghast.... I then elaborate:

Stanley Gibbons (who we introduced last month) is considered by many to be the godfather of stamp collecting. He founded the internationally successful stamp dealing and catalogue publishing business of the same name based in London. He was also a widower, four times over.

In 1872, aged 32 and by which time his stamp business was flourishing, Gibbons married his first wife, Matilda Woon, the daughter of a clergyman. Five years later she died of marasmus, a wasting disease similar to anorexia.

In 1881 he met and courted Margaret Casey, the barmaid daughter of a publican. She became his housemaid and assistant and in 1887 they married. She unfortunately died of cirrhosis of the liver in 1889.

Soon after he married a woman named Georgina of whom little is known other than having died in 1905. In that same year, now aged 65, Gibbons married 27 year old Bertha Bath, the daughter of a railway clerk. While travelling the world together buying stamp holdings, Bertha died in Ceylon in 1908 of cancer of the liver.

The following year he married Sophia Crofts. She outlived Gibbons who died in 1913 although they had most likely separated in the meantime as the bulk of Gibbon's estate was left to a 'dear' friend, Mabel Hedgecoe. Throughout his life, he had no children.

Did these wives die of boredom or neglect being married to an avid stamp collector? Most likely says my dear wife of 33 years. Jokes aside, it was rumoured though never proven, Gibbon's wives who were decidedly younger than he, may have fallen by his hand. When aged 16, he became an apprentice in his father's pharmacy business. He worked for him for over 10 years during which time he operated and grew his stamp business within the same premises. Poisoning was not uncommon in those days with forensic science not being sufficiently advanced to convincingly prove such. It was suspected Gibbon's may have utilized his pharmaceutical expertise to hasten his wives' time on earth.

Gibbon's own death was also curiously shrouded in mystery. it is said he died of a heart attack in his nephew's apartment in London though tale has it that he was transported there, wrapped in a carpet, after having died during a lustful encounter with a lady in a private room at the Savoy Hotel - you wouldn't catch me dead doing anything like that......I'd rather be soaking stamps off envelopes in my bathtub - mind you, with my wife in there at the same time.

As you can see by the Article below from The Hemisphere Stamp Collecting and Exchange Magazine there are some interesting magazines and books in the Library just waiting for you to discover.



The Philatelic Society of Western Australia

ITS OBJECTS:

The objects of the Society are to bring together all those interested in Postage and Revenue Stamps; to the reading and discussion of papers, exhibition of collections and specimens of interest, to give facilities for the exchange of duplicates, and generally to promote interest in the science and practice of Philately.

ADVANTAGES:

(1) Stamp collecting – As a good and cheap investment, could not be better, as the longer a collection is retained the more valuable it becomes. It also has the advantage of making its adherents more thorough in history and geography, and causing one to become more observant.

- (2) The reading and discussion of papers and lectures on Philately. Some of the readings are taken from the leading Philatelic papers of the world. The lectures are given sometimes from visitors overseas, and sometimes from local experts.
- (3) Exhibition of collections and specimens. On those occasions very rare and old colonial stamps may be seen.
- (4) The exchange of duplicates. Surplus stamps may be disposed of for others. The Exchange Book enables members to forward sheets or individual stamps for exchange, showing against each stamp the latest catalogue value, or be sold at a price stated.
- (5) Auction. This enables members to forward for auction sale stamps which they may desire to dispose of, the stamps going to the highest bidder. There may be a reserve price on each.
- (6) Deceased member's collections. Relatives have the right to apply to the society for advise an all matters relating to the retenction or disposal of collections of stamps left by deceased members. There is a special committee of experts formed to deal with such matters.
- (7) Membership. The membership subscription is 5/- per annum for ladies, as well as gentlemen. With local members very pleasant evenings may be spent at the society's meetings. There are many country, interstate and overseas members on the roll of the society, who take advantage of the exchange book, and auction.
- (8) Meetings. The meetings of the society are held at 7.30 p.m. on the third Tuesday in each month, at the Sports Club Rooms Viking House, William-street, Perth, Western Australia.

The December meeting of the Society was held on Tuesday, 20th inst., at the Sports Club Rooms, Viking House, William Street, Perth.

There were the following members present: H.B.Higham, H.M.Giles, L.G.Trouchet, A.E.Kildahl, G.A.Goss, P.E.C.de Mouncey, F.W.Lawson, Mrs.Eggleston, J.Honey, J.Hughes, E.E.Nelson, and E.Black.

The meeting was opened at 8 p.m. by the Vice-President (Mr.H.B.Highham), who announced that Mr.G.A.Goss had been approached to accept the position of President of the Society for the ensuing year. Mr.Goss had very kindly consented, and he (Mr.Higham) had much pleasure in handing the chair over to him.

Mr.Goss, in occupying the chair, thanked the members for his election to the position.

Mr. Higham also stated that the Committee had elected Mr.R. Allison to the secretaryship of the society, in the place of Mr. Tipping (the late Secretary), who had left the State.

Mr.Lawson brought up the question of the exchange book, in which he stated members were retaing it for longer periods than allowed by the rules. He moved that the attention of the whole of the members be drawn to the time limit allowed in which the exchange book can be retained by each member, by having slips printed to that effect and attached to the monthly notices of meetings forwarded to each member. Carried.

Mr.L.G.Trouchet placed on the table for inspection of the members a complete sheet, twenty in number, of the 6d. St. Johns, Newfoundland, stamps. They were the issue of 1861-62, the colour lake, imperforated, unused, and without gum. Also a block of six Mexican 3 centavos stamps. The stamps were of two distinct uniform shades. Three were of a light red, whilst the others were of a very dark shade of red.

A stamp of St.Lucia was surcharged in black Öne Pency,"instead of Öne Penny,"and a South Australian 2d. surcharged with a letter Ë"in black

AUCTION

Mr.Giles brought forward for the auction two Victorian 1d and 2d charity stamps issued during the South African war. Both were postmarked 5.6.1900. Reserve, 5/-. There being no bid, they were withdrawn.
