SWANPEX '87 SOUTH PERTH CIVIC CENTRE 14TH-15TH NOVEMBER 1987

Swanpex 87 will be conducted in conjunction with the annual STMMP SHOW under the auspices of the N.A. Philatelic Council at the South Perth Civic Centre on Saturday 14th and Sunday 15th November 1987. The STAMP SHOW will be open between 10am and 5pm on both days.

Entry Guide Lines

- Each entry should consist of 30 or 45 page collection. These pages must be enclosed in transparent covers for displaying in frames provided at the STAMP SHOW.
- Every entry must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
- 3 Fees shall be \$5 for each 15 pages. Literature \$5 with two copies to be supplied (one will be returned)
- All entries will be held in a selected place of security, All reasonable care will be taken of entries but no liability shall be attached to the organisers for any loss or damage arising from any cause whatsoever. The completion of the entry from shall constitute acceptance of these conditions.
 - 5 All completed entry froms together with the prescribed fee should be in the hands of the Chairman of Judges at GPO BOX 9800 Perth WA 6001 not later than 14th October 1987.
- The exhibits must be in the hands of the Council by 2nd November 1987 and will be returned to each entrant as soon as possible after the closure of the STAMP SHOW.

Classes avaiable:

- Australia, its Territories, States.
- British Commonwealth.
- Rest of World.
- Postal History, Stationery, Aerophilately
- Thematics, Cinderellas.
- Literature (book, manuscript, club magazine) 7
 - Modern (post 1952) from 1 to 4.

Awards:

The judging panel has at their disposal medal levels of gold, vermail, large silver, silver silver-bronze and bronze medals. Certificate of merit will be also given. All entries will receive a certificate indicating the judges award. Special trophies will be awarded at the discretion of the jury.

Judging Guidelines:

Basically exhibits compete against a standard. The particular areas that are considered in judging each entry are: philatelic knowldege, development and treatment, condition, rarity, and presentation. A judging report sheet will be provided with the return of the entry. It is probable that a judging critique will be held during the weekend.

ABORTGINAL CRAFTS VENDING MACHINE STAMP FOLDERS

On Wednesday 19th August Australia Post will Issue two new Vending Machine Stamp Folders at 80c and \$2. The new designs will feature Aboriginal Crafts, which are part of the collection held at the Museum of Victoria.

Aboriginal crafts cover a wide range of art, technology, materials and uses. Like all aspects of Aboriginal culture, craft designs and skills have great antiquity, but most are still practised today.

Art and craft are well integrated. Utilitarian articles such as bowls, shields, spearthrowers and baskets, and items of apparel such as belts are carefully made and decorated with traditional designs.

There is also great regional diversity. For example, shields decorated by painting in one area might be incised in another. Shields from the Western Desert are usually lightweight and painted, while those of the southern Kimberleys are most likely heavy and undecorated.

Portability and versatility are important factors in design, some wooden vessels are used for carrying goods such as food or for winnowing seeds when making flour. Others can double as digging implements. Spearthrowers and shields are made from wood and often have painted or incised decoration. These weapons can also be used as platters or as bases for mixing flour or ochres.

Baskets and belts are deftly woven from different vegetable fibres. Some feature intricate painted designs which are achieved by using locally found vegetable dyes, or by application of ochre to the finished product.

The Designs:

3c Spearthrower.

From the Warburton River, Western Australia, and made before 1945, the wooden weapon is incised with a zig-zag design.

- 15c Shield. The shield is thought to date from the nineteenth century. It is from New South Wales, made of hardwood and decorated with a zig-zag and concentric diamond design.
- 37c Bowl.

 Made, during the last twenty years, by the Pintubi people of Central Australia. The wooden carrying vessel is painted with a design of circles and dots.
 - 37c Basket.

 Prom Arukun Queensland. Coiled basket, made in the early 1980s from pandanus palm fibre and vegetable root dwes at Arukun. Queensland.
- 37c Belt. From Arnhem Land, and dating back at least to the 1920s, this article of apparel is made from plaited split cane, It was decorated with painted dots and stripes.

With all these objects the designer has sought to emphasise the texture, shapes and contrasts of the materials used, by showing close-up details. The stamps were designed by Jim Passmore, of Australia Post Graphic Design Studio.
