## The Daytime Stamp Club

The new year started with 15 members attending February's Daytime Stamp Club meeting at the scout hall in Rokeby Road, Subiaco. Penny Wells presented her collection of *New Zealand Government Life Insurance Stamps and Postage Dues for the period 1899 to the 1950s.* 

The March meeting of the Daytime stamp club saw about 20 members in attendance. In lieu of a display of philatelic material, Paul Gentelli gave a presentation on the history of the Phrygian Cap and the adoption of Marianne as the embodiment of the French Republic and the incorporation of both into the designs of French stamps.

The first stamp showing the Phrygian Cap was issued in 1849 and, according to Paul's estimation, the image in different forms has appeared 60+ times since then.

Paul made the point that the Phrygian Cap developed a particular persona during and following the Revolution in France of 1789.

Prior to the Revolution the Phrygian Cap represented friendship and freedom but as the level of violence increased during the Revolution this changed. The establishment of the 'Committee of Public Safety' instituted "the reign of terror". The wearing of the Cap was a means of showing loyalty to the cause and conformity to the aims of the Revolution. Foreigners, royalists, and conservatives were obvious if they did not wear the Cap. Madame Guillotine was waiting.

The sans-culottes, the common people of the lower classes became radicalised and supported the Revolution as a result of the poverty which characterised their existence under the Ancien Régime. The working class, the sans-culottes wore pantaloons, or long trousers, instead of the culottes, or knee breeches, worn by the nobility and bourgeoisie of the time. They also adopted the Phrygian Cap.

Marianne, (a compound name derived from Marie and Anne – two of the most common names in France at the time) wearing her Phrygian Cap was also adopted by the Revolution as the embodiment of Liberty, Equality and Fraternity.






### Marianne wears the Phrygian Cap

During the Second World War the Vichy rule of particular regions of France strongly rejected the Marianne symbolism – as the 'Mother of France'. Of the 427 monuments to Marianne in Vichy France, 120 were melted down. The Milice destroyed all images in Mairies and Joan of Arc was inserted as 'Mother of France' with images of type: "Liberty, Leading the People".

In modern times Marianne has been reinstalled and put to service in the interests of women's issues, feminism, ecology and environmentalism.



### Postmark Circle....Continued from Page 1

As examples of "Items of Interest", convenor, Brian Austin, brought along some recent mail from a friend's travels. One, sent from the Ukraine and posted on 15 June 2024, arrived on 30 January 2025. Another, being a January 2025 postcard from Equatorial Guinea arrived more recently.

To show the range of types of postmarks Brian Austin also presented a number of pages of worldwide postmarks from a display made up for the Postmark Club some years ago. These showed postmarks on individual stamps and pieces as well as covers. He also presented a range of postal markings that showed what could be retrieved from the average commercial bin – in this case covers addressed to a Perth hospital in the late 1980s with CDS, slogans, meter marks, postage paid imprints, RTS markings, sorting marks, etc.

Complementing this material, John Dibiase brought a fine display of material showing the early postal markings of Afghanistan. These featured the unusual

method of cancelling stamps that saw a piece torn or cut from the stamp, as well as the "crossed swords" manuscript markings, and others. It demonstrated a very different side to postal markings.

In the discussions it was pointed out that postmarks are not just circular date stamps but encompass a large range of markings. These can be collected on cover, on piece or just on the stamp, it depends what you are collecting and what you can get.

Sometimes, the postmark is common or the stamp is common but put the two together and it can make a difference. While it would be great to get a nice strike on a full cover, sometimes just getting a part cancel on a stamp is all that is available and, in some cases, all that exists.

It is a great adjunct to any stamp collection to have some of the related postmarks of your favoured collecting area. It also fills in those gaps when the wallet restricts the purchase of that desired mint high value item.

Members interested in the collection and study of Australian and worldwide postmarks, this PSWA gathering is for you. No postmark can ever be deemed too humble.

The next meeting is scheduled for Monday 12 May 2025 commencing at 7.30 pm at Philatelic House, Lord Street, East Perth. The topic for the evening is "Airmails". Members are encouraged to participate by bringing any relevant material to complement the monthly topic.

## The Philatelic Forum

The Philatelic Forum held its first meeting for 2025 on 3 February with 11 people in attendance. The meeting resolved that Glen Stafford would chair the meetings for the balance of 2025.

The meeting considered three of the Western Australian entries for the New Zealand Royalpex Exhibition and the Sydney (Full National) Exhibition – both being held in March. These comprised:

- Brian Morrey's *Battle of the Falklands* (1 Frame);
- Dianne Saunders' Antarctica (5 Frames); and,
- Glen Stafford's Guatemala Revenue Stamps (1 Frame).

Glen Stafford spoke on the design of exhibit title pages based on a virtual exhibition from India.

The meeting agreed the topic for the 7 April meeting look at the best ways to set out "The End Page of an Exhibit".

It was noted that Swanpex will again be held in conjunction with the Rockingham and Districts Stamp Club, as a one-day event at Rockingham on 3 August 2025. Mike Kouwen will be the Organising Chairman while the Jury will comprise John DiBiase (Chair), Keith Michaelson and Andrew Watson (Members) and Brian Morrey (Apprentice).

The March meeting of the Forum was held on 3 March and attended by 11 people. It was agreed that members would bring a copy of a Title Page and the related End Page of an exhibit to the April meeting to facilitate discussion on the design of End Pages.

Glen Stafford was congratulated on his Nicaraguan Postal Stationery exhibit for which he received 93 points at the Uruguay (FIP) exhibition in February.

Two Sydney Exhibition entries were displayed for the interest of members. These comprised Dianne Saunders' Antarctica exhibit and Brian Morrey's revamped Falkland Islands 'WAR STAMP' Overprints 1918-1920 Exhibit.

John DiBiase reviewed the recently published FIAP 50<sup>th</sup>



Anniversary 1974-2024 Golden Jubilee book. A tome weighing some 6 kilograms, comprising 13 Chapters and 658 pages.

The book covers the history and growth of the FIAP which initially started life in 1974 with three member countries. Over the period it has grown and now lists 34 countries as members.

The book includes a listing of all the FIAP Grand Prix winners, of which ten are Australians. John has donated the book to the PSWA library where it may be viewed during the Association's regular monthly Library Day (10.00 am to 4.00 pm, first Saturday of each month, at Philatelic House).




## **Library Day Notes**

Joe was always a strong supporter of the PSWA.



# **Another Forgotten WA Timber Mill Re-found**

A little while back I published an article about finding a cover sent from the obscure forgotten timber mill of Amphion. It was with some surprise that I recently found another link to an obscure timber mill – this time the small mill of Tullis.

Located on the now defunct railway line between Dwellingup and Boddington toward the eastern side of the jarrah forest just to the west of Boddington, it was only ever a small timber mill town.

It had a postal facility from November 1938 through to October 1952 when the mill closed. It had a postmark which is recorded from 17 September 1940 through to the close. Needless to say, examples of Tullis postmarks are in the same league as Group Settlements, being quite scarce if not rare.

In this instance it is not a matter of mail from Tullis, but rather, mail to Tullis.

From the point of view of most collectors, it is probably a not very pretty, partly stained cover from Italy. It is franked with some cheap Italian definitives and for most people, not worth a second glance.

It is, however, probably the only piece of inwards mail to this small timber town that exists. To me it is a nice addition to my collection of material related to the old timber mills of the south west.

The first event is scheduled to take place from 27 November 2025, to 28 February 2026.

Entries close on Sunday 28 September 2025.

Title Pages are to be with the Judges by Monday 5 October 2025.

Scans are to be submitted by Monday 20 October 2025.

As a national virtual exhibition, it offers collectors the opportunity to exhibit their philatelic collections online, eliminating the need for physical attendance. This format not only broadens accessibility, but also allows for a diverse range of exhibits to be displayed to a global audience.

### **January General Meeting**

It was reported that the Les King Trophy was missing from the trophy cabinet and there's no record of where it has gone. Members were asked to make enquiries as to its whereabouts.

Dr Bruce Haynes kindly donated copies of:

- The Paris Library of Philatelic Literature
- The Stamp of Australia by Kelly Burke. A book on the story of Australia's mail from the 2nd fleet to the 21st century.

These publications will be available to members through the PSWA Library on Library Days.

Mrs Deanna Clark was elected by the members present to membership of the PSWA.

The scheduled display of New Acquisitions and nonstamp displays by members resulted in five presentations:

Mr George Morris displayed Cinderella stamps:

- bicycle mail;

- Japanese invasion banknotes relating to Australia;

Two Membership Applications were considered by the membership and approved. The President welcomed Mr Tim Pratten and Mr Willy Loffelmann to membership of the Society.



Mr Steve Hoath presented his **Great White Fleet postcard exhibit** to the meeting.

It was a highly acclaimed exhibit, having been awarded a Large Vermeil (81 points) at the Canberra National Stamp Show in September 2024.

The five-frame exhibit documented the American fleet's visit to Sydney, Melbourne and Albany as part of its round the world tour in 1908.

The hulls of the ships were painted white, hence the name Great White Fleet.




Rare Comical - Yankee Doodle postcard


It is estimated that over 500,000 people (many from country areas) turned out to greet the arrival in Sydney of the American fleet with its 14,000 sailors and Marines. A very impressive turn-out given the official 1911 census recorded the population of Sydney as 629,503.

The Fleet was received in Melbourne and Albany with the same enthusiasm.

Hundreds of postcards were produced to celebrate the visit. The exhibit presented the range of these postcards showing the various activities and events that occurred in celebration of the visit.

Albany was considered a village compared to Sydney and Melbourne. The majority of the Albany postcards were produced by local photographers.

Companies made use of the Fleet's visit to advertise their products. The Singer Sewing Machine Co., for example, decided to promote its sewing machines by providing postcards on the Australian activity of hunting Kangaroo.

The Singer Sewing Machine Company issued an enveloped set of eight postcards titled: "Kangaroo Hunting in Australia", printed using the Lithographic process.



### **March General Meeting**

Mr Roger Cumming presented his collection of the Australian Post Office's Hermes branding which was adopted sometime before 1929 and persisted through to 1954.

In the period 1929 to 1940 the Hermes design was shaded. Thereafter, the design was unshaded.

In 1954, the Post Office introduced a new Hermes series which incorporated either a red triangle or blue triangle into the design.





That logo finished in 1965, but it occasionally pops up from time to time. Roger showed a receipt from the Australian Philatelic Bureau in Melbourne, issued on 27 January 1996, which demonstrated this point.
