# **Philatelic Forum Notes**

The topic for the April meeting was the "Design of Powerful End Pages" of an exhibit.

Thirteen examples were displayed, consisting of the title page and the related end page of an exhibit, each showcasing the conclusion to the exhibit's story line on a wide variety of subjects.

Display sheets were presented by: John DiBiase, Susan Lally (2), David Mazitelli, Ian Culshaw, Geroge Morris, Steve Hoath (3), Jeannine Millsteed (2) and Glen Stafford (2).

The meeting congratulated the WA exhibitors at the Sydney Expo who obtained the following results: Ray Todd – Gold; Glen. Stafford – Large Gold; Brian Morrey – Gold; Dianne Saunders – Large Silver (to be reviewed) plus Special Prize; Jeannine Millsteed – Bronze (Novice).

John DiBiase presented a review of the recently released *Netherlands East Indies (Indonesia) Stamp Collection 1655-1870*, by Tay Peng Hian AMN RDP (2024). This 4kg tome is of the highest quality, contains 346 gilt edge pages, hard cover and dust jacket case. The book showcases most of the rarest items in Netherland East Indies stamps.



The May meeting of the Forum focussed on the "Judging of First Day Cover Exhibits". Glen Stafford provided a well researched power point presentation on the criteria required for successful exhibiting of First Day Covers. Glen also provided a set of hardcopy Guidelines for all attendees.

# Principles of Exhibit Composition

- First Day Cover philatelic exhibits may include design drafts for creating First Day Cover, proofs and samples produced during the printing process;
- They may also use design drafts for commemorative postmarks and stamp samples issued on the first day of stamp issue as materials.



Two exhibits were displayed for comment: Glen Stafford's *Ghana First Day Covers from Independence*, comprising five frames; and David Mazitelli's, *A Rose by Any Other Name*, of one frame.

The June meeting topic was the upcoming Thailand 2025 Exhibition entries. Two exhibits were presented for comment; Glen Stafford's eight frame *Nicaraguan Airmail Stamps*; 1929 – 1937 entry and John DiBiase's five frame Afghanistan entry.

The history of these nation states is a study in itself – let alone collecting the philatelic material they issued. It also included a very nice subset of Crete in its independent period (Cretan State 1898 to 1913).

A fascinating collection and well worth a look. The

material had been thoroughly researched and contained some remarkable covers.



# Vale Barry Wilkinson

16 June 1946 – 15 June 2025



Barry Wilkinson was born in Coventry, England, on 16 June 1946. An early baby boomer, he attended Whitmore Park Primary School, Coventry.

He was always a collector. Hornby trains, Dinky Toys, Meccano, model aeroplanes, stamps and old objects were his passion.

While Barry finished school early, he never finished his love of history and of collecting.

Like all collectors, his early interests set the pattern for his subsequent interest in Western Australian stamps, travel, old towns, villages and hamlets. Western Australian ghost towns, their history - postal and social - became an abiding passion.

Barry's family emigrated to Australia in 1958. They landed at Station Pier, Melbourne in1959 and lived for a short time in at an immigrant settlement in Morwell, Victoria, before establishing themselves in Geelong.

Barry's first job on leaving school at age 16 was with a farm machinery business. From there he moved to work on the installation of electrical cables at the Morwell Power Station.

Barry moved to Western Australia in the 1970s and married his wife, Carmel, in 1974.

Barry was a very early collector of Western Australian postmarks; an interest that was encouraged by Tom Glee who had a stamp business in Beaufort Street, Perth, during the 1970s and 80s.

Barry was a regular contributor to the Western Australia Study Group and the PSWA's many activities from Library Day, Daytime Stamp Club and all other activities run by the Society. He had a deep and broad knowledge of postmarks and airmails. His knowledge of aircraft of the early days of airmail postage was remarkable.



Catalinas he knew inside out. In his last days at Osborne Park Hospital he was found watching a movie on his television screen about a Catalina that was in trouble during WWII. Very dramatic. His comment was: "That's not a Catalina cockpit, it's all wrong. Just a Hollywood set", and laughed.

And, so it was. His interest and knowledge of the Western Australian Woodlines and the postal system that serviced the exploited workers was equally deeply felt. He loved spending his time hunting out their locations in the bush around Kalgoorlie; four wheel driving along the remnants and developing an intimate understanding of the system.

While he never exhibited via the formal exhibition mechanism, he shared his material with members and wrote articles for PSWA's *Stamp Hinges* for the benefit of others who have similar interests, and for the broader PSWA membership.

Barry had that lovely dry Australian sense of humour. Understated, insightful, laconic, ironic and irreverent.

You are sadly missed, Barry. Rest in Peace.

The top price of \$300 was realised by Lot No 1, described in the catalogue as: 'KGV kiloware, weight approx. 600 grams mainly low value stamps on paper - 1d greens, 2d reds, 2d orange with a sprinkling of higher values many thousands of stamps' at a reserve of \$120.

The highest reserve price was \$2,000 for Lot No 238, described as 'French Antarctic; Stock books with Mint collection 1954 - 1997 (Cat \$9,000+'. The Lot was passed in.

WA Postmarks remained buoyant with 61 Lots listed and 38 sold. Highest price realised was \$100 for Lot No 315 "1904 MIDLAND JUNCTION 3b index 9 unlisted on pair red swans".

There was a good turn-out of collectors with the dealers having a brisk start to the day – although it tapered towards the end.

Penny Wells had had her daughter Chris out and about. It was nice to see Chris enjoying Penny's stall and chatting to Penny's clients and other PSWA members.

The June General Meeting of PSWA was a treat for those who attended and who had an interest in KGVs – especially the 4d and the rarer items including plate proofs and colour trails.

Greg Morgan exhibited approximately thee and a half frames of his "under construction" exhibit, including some very fine covers.

Greg mentioned in his comments the interesting thing about the colour trial for the 4d brown is that Harrison, the printer, was asked to replicate the colour of the 1914 6d engraved Kookaburra in the printing of the 4d brown. Apparently, this proved to be impossible using the letterpress method.
